Secret Agent Society (SAS) Small Group Program is an evidence-based breakthrough approach for clinical and school services to empower:

Strong Evidence-Base.

Originally designed and demonstrated effectiveness for autism, the **evidence-base and use** is with children aged 8 to 12 with identified social and emotional challenges, including autism, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), and anxiety disorders. With over 17 publications to-date, research has been conducted in Australia, Ireland, Canada, and USA, and currently three very exciting major research studies are underway or under preparation for publication.
