Secret Agent Society (SAS) Small Group Program is an evidence-based breakthrough approach for clinical and school services to empower:

- 1. Emotion Recognition (in other people and self);
- 2. Emotion Regulation (particularly anxiety and anger);
- 3. Social Skills (for friendship, team work and getting along with others!); and
- 4. **Problem Solving** (as an individual and in a group).

Evidence-based content & program structure.

Originally designed and demonstrated effectiveness for autism, the evidence-base and use is with children aged 8 to 12 with identified social and emotional challenges, including autism, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), and anxiety disorders. With over 19 publications to-date, including four Randomised Controlled Trials, research has been conducted in Australia, Ireland, Canada, and USA.

As an innovative digital health solution, SAS involves an intuitive and engaging software package lead by clinical or education professionals. The software (including espionage-themed gamified learning) streamlines group sessions, between-session activities, and adult information sharing for both face-to-face or telehealth services.

The digital health approach allows for:

- Uninterrupted program access and skill development during periods of isolation from the community;
- Flexibility to reach more families through remote delivery;
- Automated pre-post assessment administration and scoring;
- Real-time group progress reporting; and
- Ensures program fidelity for maximum results and service quality.
